

Congratulations to:

Grace L Connell has lived in the neatly maintained house at 701 Morton Ave for 70 years. One neighbor describes Grace as one of the strongest women he has ever met. The Craftsman style house is known as "The House of Seven Gables". Sally Lawson has lived continuously at 2717 Cambridge Street since 1966, exactly 50 years. Her home was built in 1947 and she has proudly maintained the single story bungalow home. It is the jewel of the neighborhood.

The purpose of this program is to call attention to and honor our neighborhood's long-time residents. The living memory and the presence of these individuals in our neighborhood contribute a distinct sense of place to Union Park and a source of stability within a quickly changing world.

Des Moines Rowing Club

The Des Moines Rowing Club (DMRC) is a 501c3 created to promote the sport of rowing in Central Iowa. The club was founded in 1983 and hosted its first regatta - named Head of the Des Moines - that same year. Since then, the club has grown to over 200 members. Although most members live in the Des Moines metropolitan area, the club does include rowers from Ames, Indianola, Marshalltown and surrounding communities.

The club is run by a volunteer board of directors that meets once a month. Board members are supported by volunteer committees consisting of other members. As a part of the annual membership requirements, each member must contribute 15 hours of volunteer support to the club, five of which are to support the annual Head of the Des Moines, a 5K head race between the Botanical Center and Prospect Park, held the last Saturday in September and attended by rowing clubs throughout the Midwest. Sadly, due to river conditions, and our #1 priority in keeping rowers safe, the Regatta has been cancelled for this year.

The club rents space at Gray's Lake in Overlook Terrace, where we offer community Learn to Row classes, both sweep (one oar per person and a cox directs the crew) and sculling (one person has two oars and no cox in the boat), as well as hold our summer long Novice program. The club also rents space at Birdland Marina, where the experienced members row on the river. The club also has a Juniors program for local high school students, as well as an adaptive program for paraplegic rowers.

The club provides and maintains the docks for rowers use as well as community use. The club has adopted the shoreline around the Birdland Marina area to help with neighborhood beautification efforts.

The rowing season typically runs from March through November, but depending on weather, some rowers brave the elements and row year round. The off season is spent inside the Guzman building at Birdland Marina doing equipment maintenance, practicing on the ergometers (called ergs or rowing machines), and holding enrichment classes for members on rowing related topics. New for this year is the introduction of community classes related to rowing, starting with erging for veterans with PSD in conjunction with the VA.

In Case You Missed It

March - Two new benches were installed by UPNA in Union Park this spring near Mattern and East 9th. The benches were paid for by Polk County grant money. They are located by a planter, also built by UPNA with Polk County Grant money, where the Des Moines Park and Recreation has planted various butterfly friendly plant species.

May 21st – the Heritage Carousel opened for the season with the First Rider of the Year contest (1 year old TJ was the winner). The season ended August 23. Rides for children are still 50 cents, thanks to the Rollin Relics.

May 24 – Animal Rescue League of Iowa offered free spay and neuter and veterinary services to Union Park residents.

June 3rd – Rendezvous on Riverview (now known simply as "ROR") was held every Friday night in June and July on the Riverview Island. Great bands were featured each week.

July - Yoga in the Park was held in Union Park near the Rocket Slide every Saturday Morning during June.

July 29 – Grand View University hosted Jazz in July, west of the Rasmussen Center. The Pride of Iowa Chorus warmed up the stage for The High Society Big Band.

August 7th - Clowns at the Carousel. This annual free family event is held at the Heritage Carousel.

August 28^{th} – the 16^{th} Annual Cruise to the Carousel Car Show was held at the Heritage Carousel, sponsored by the Rollin Relics Car Club. It is the largest annual contributor to the Heritage Carousel to keep the cost of rides at 50 cents for children.

August 27th - Parks Area Sweet Corn Day – This annual event offers all you can eat fresh sweet corn on the cob plus watermelon and beverages. Held on 6th Ave, between Euclid and Douglas Avenues in Des Moines with the live background sounds of the Backstage Boogie Band

Know When to Call 911

An emergency is any situation that requires immediate assistance from the police, fire department or ambulance. Examples include:

If you're not sure whether the situation is a true emergency, officials recommend calling 911 and letting the call-taker determine whether you need emergency help.

When calling 911, be prepared to answer the following questions:

The location of the emergency, including street address

The phone number you are calling from

The nature of the emergency

Details of the emergency

Follow instructions. Most 911 centers can tell you exactly what to do to assist in an emergency until help arrives, such as providing step-by-step instructions to aid someone who is choking or needs first aid or CPR. Remain on the line until instructed otherwise.

If you dial 911 by mistake, do not hang up! Simply explain to the call-taker what happened.

Since 911 was introduced in 1968, efforts to raise public awareness about 911 have been effective. The Des Moines Fire Department transported over 15,000 patients last year, many of which did not require immediate medical attention.
