Bring the family, lawn chairs and friendly pets to hear Betsy Hickok and the Standards from 2 - 4pm on the lawn near the East Shelter on Thompson Avenue. We are pleased to host this live jazz in the Union Park neighborhood and the greater East Side!

Members of the Betsy Hickok and the Standards group include Betsy Hickok (Vocals), Dave Rezek (Trumpet), Ron Roberts (Guitar), and Scott Barnum (Bass). Betsy Hickok has performed as a solo jazz vocalist, and as a member of the Iowa City-based group "Too Much Yang." In 2006, she released her first solo jazz album featuring jazz standards, and the Iowa City Press-Citizen said in its review, "Betsy Hickok boasts a cool, clear water delivery, impeccable timing, and the knowing gift for phrasing that can only come from a long, loving immersion in classic jazz." Hickok has appeared several times in the Iowa City Jazz Festival, the Jazz from Riverside Theatre series, and in numerous local and regional venues. Betsy Hickok has been a part of the Iowa City jazz scene for 20 years, and recently moved to Ames, Iowa.

This is the sixth year of a jazz concert in or near the park! The Heritage Carousel will be open; kids can also enjoy the Rocket Slide and other playground equipment as well as the wading pool.

Union Park Neighborhood Association will provide free drinks and cookies. Ice cream from Kaleidoscoops and other treats will be available for purchase.

As they find a "winner", Tom and Yvonne place a green and white sign in the yard for one week to proclaim the yard as the "Union Park Neighborhood Lawn of the Week". The winners will be honored at this year's Fall General Meeting, with a slide show that features the winning lawns, and the recipients will receive a certificate of achievement and a gift certificate.

She said she grew up in Highland Park area, but moved away for a long time and then returned to Des Moines a few years ago. Portable Weather Radios

Now Iowans can protect themselves from Iowa's most dangerous season for great low price. Weather radios are available at all Fareway locations in Iowa for the low price of \$29.99. These NOAA Weather Radios can be programmed to trigger for specific counties. WHO-HD Channel 13 announced that it is again partnering with central Iowa Fareway Stores to sell life-saving NOAA Weather Radios just in time for Iowa's most dangerous season. The state-of-theart Oregon Scientific NOAA weather radios, programmable to the county level, regularly retail for \$59.95 but are on sale now at the Fareway Stores for just \$29.99 while supplies last.

"This is a small price to pay for a lot of protection," says Channel 13 Chief Meteorologist Ed Wilson. "We can keep you safe once you're watching TV. But what we can't do is wake you up when a warn-

ing is issued. This weather radio will. Plus, it's completely portable and small enough to slip right into a purse or boat bag."

Jeff Stearns, Vice President of Marketing and Promotions for Fareway says, "Fareway is excited to partner with WHO-HD Channel 13 to bring our shoppers an affordable and convenient way to purchase weather radios in our stores to help keep their families safe during severe weather."

In central Iowa, the state-of-theart weather radios are available at the 41 Fareway stores located in all Des Moines metro stores.

These Oregon Scientific weather radios have the National Weather Service's (NWS) SAME (Specific Area Message Encoding) technology to alert you only of weather and other emergencies for the county(s) the user has programmed into them. Weather radios without this technology would receive an alert for emergencies anywhere within the coverage area of the National Weather Service transmitter, typically several counties, even though the emergency could be well away from the listener.



"N11" Codes

"N11" codes - N11 is a three-digit shortcut to reach special community resources. These phone numbers are set aside by the Federal Communications Commission and operated by the community service provider. A website has been created containing the information. It is found here: http://www.iowa.gov/pages/n11

The following N11 codes are available for Iowans to use:

211 – Community information and referral services, including food, shelters, clothes, health insurance programs, support groups, counseling, financial assistance, meal services, child care, legal services, etc. There are 2-1-1 call centers serving all 99 counties in Iowa.

311 - Nonemergency police, fire and

municipal business. Local and municipal governments administer 311 calls.

411 – Local telephone directory assistance. Landline 4-1-1 service is provided by local telephone companies. Wireless services are provided by your wireless phone carrier. Some telephone companies and wireless carriers charge for this service.

511 – Travel information, including the status of roadway construction, accidents, detours and winter road conditions. Iowa information is provided by the Iowa DOT. 511 services are available in most other states. The information you receive is based on the location from where you are calling. 511 is the abbreviated number for 800-288-1047 (available nationwide).

611 – For customers of some telephone companies, 611 is used to report a problem with telephone service. Many wireless phone providers also use 611 as a general customer service access number.

711 – The Telecommunications Relay Service that allows people who are deaf, hard-of-hearing or speech-disabled to place calls to standard telephone users via a keyboard or other assistive device.

811 – This "Call before You Dig" number arranges for utilities to be located and marked, preventing damage that can interrupt service and place the public at risk.

911 – Emergency response.

Dart Riders Prepare for Major Service Changes

Regional Transit Authority (DART) took effect Sunday, June 10. The changes affected Express Routes, On Call services and the D-Line Downtown Shuttle. Most local bus routes will be unaffected in June. The recent changes that affected riders were:

Express Routes: Express Routes are limited-stop commuter trips between the suburbs and downtown. Several routes are significantly rerouted, including Routes 91 and 92. Riders along Lower Beaver Road will now be served by Route 6. One route, Route 90, is being discontinued; riders to the Airport South Business Park will now be served by Route 8. The downtown routing is changing for all Express Routes, which will travel predominantly on Grand Avenue and Locust Street and no longer on Walnut Street.

Capitol Hill Employees: Express Routes will no longer provide direct service between downtown and the Capitol Complex. That connection will now be made by the D-Line Downtown Shuttle, a free-to-ride downtown shuttle that will operate on Grand Avenue

Major changes to the Des Moines Area and Locust Street between 17th Street in the Western Gateway to East 12th Street on the east side of the Capitol. A third bus is being added to the shuttle service all day to help meet the increased demand.

> Suburban On Call Riders: On Call services in Clive, Urbandale and West Des Moines are all changing significantly. The Clive On Call is being replaced with the Route 92

> Hickman Express. The Urbandale On Call (Zones 1-4) is being replaced with the new Urbandale / Windsor Heights Flex Route 73. The West Des Moines On Call is being replaced with the new West Des Moines / Clive Flex Route 72.

> The June service change is the first of two phases of implementing the Year 1 recommendations of the DART Forward Services Plan, which is a plan for expanding service throughout Greater Des Moines, including a 13 percent increase in overall service in 2012. A second phase of service changes affecting local routes will occur in November to coincide with the opening of DART Central Station, which is under construction at 620 Cherry Street in downtown Des Moines.

Riders are encouraged to research these changes. Detailed information including new schedules with route maps is available online at www.ridedart.com/june-2012-servicechanges.cfm. Printed schedules will be available at DART's pass sales outlets, including Dahl's, HyVee and Walmart locations. Riders with any questions about the service changes are encouraged to call DART Customer Service at 515-283-8100.

The Des Moines Area Regional Transit Authority is the public transportation provider that serves Polk County. DART operates a family of transportation services that makes getting around the Greater Des Moines area easier and more convenient. Two of the biggest concerns we hear from residential customers relate to leaks in service lines and inoperable stop boxes. Customers are responsible for maintaining their water service line, including the stop box, and when a service line or stop box needs repaired, the cost to repair is often significant and unexpected. For many customers, this can be devastating to the family budget.

To provide customers an option, Des

Moines Water Works has recently requested proposals from service providers to offer a service line warranty program to our customers. DMWW has committed to performing all the due diligence to ensure the program is costeffective, offers full coverage without "small print exclusions," and is overall, in our customers' best interests.

We would like to invite residential customers to participate in a Customer Advisory Council to review DMWW's recommended provider and program and provide feedback.


Solid Waste Time of Collection- Please place your cart and other materials to be collected such as yard wastes and recyclables at your designated collection location no later than 6:30 a.m. on your scheduled collection day and no earlier than 5:00 p.m. on the day before your scheduled collection. No person shall allow solid waste containers to remain on the parking or terrace of the street in front of that person's premises for more

than 12 hours after the date designated for solid waste. Cart owners may be fined for carts that are left out after collection day. For habitual violators, the carts may be confiscated.

Reporting street lights – If you see a streetlight that is out, stays on during the day or blinks on and off. Call 800-799-4443 if you see a streetlight that is out, stays on during the day or blinks on and off. Or report on line at http://www.midamericanenergy.com/streetlight_outage.aspx

Provide the location, address or intersection and any specifics that will help repair the light. It is real easy. It just takes a little time to write down the address and a few minutes to call them.

The Food Pantry at 1618 6th Avenue is open to all residents of the City of Des Moines. Des Moines Community Action Agency (Community Services) works with low-income residents to provide crisis assistance and provide some tools to help low-income residents gain personal and economic self-sufficiency.
