2012 Alice Rodine – Robert Mickle Volunteer Awards

Five members of the Union Park Neighborhood Association attended the 2012 Alice Rodine-Robert Mickle Volunteer Awards and potluck, hosted by Des Moines Neighbors, on April 26 at the Mickle Center in Sherman Hill. The event was held to recognize individuals and businesses nominated by their neighborhoods to receive awards for their volunteer efforts and their commitment to improving their neighborhoods.

Jack Daugherty, former Co-Chair of the Union Park Neighborhood Association, received a citizen award and a special overall award for his tireless volunteer and fundraising efforts for the betterment of the Union Park Neighborhood. Specifically, he was honored for leading the flood recovery effort in the Birdland area in 2008 and spearheaded fundraising to restore the pillars and surrounding area in the southeast corner of Union Park, Jack and his wife, Meghan, also have helped with other neighborhood activities, including the newsletter, Annual Neighborhood Garage Sale, Home Tour, Jazz in July festival, Movies in the Park, and the Lawn of the Week program. Jack was instrumental in designing a logo for UPNA for use on stationery and T-shirts. He initiated several fundraising efforts for the association, including a calendar that featured turn-of-the-century postcards of Union Park.

The emcee for the event, Des Moines Neighbors president Marty Mauk, explained who Alice Rodine and Robert Mickle were, and the values they stood for. He described how involved they were with City staff in their roles as advocates for Des Moines neighborhoods.

Des Moines Neighbors treasurer Bill Schoenenberger addressed the citizens, city employees, and businesses receiving awards, calling them exceptional leaders in their neighborhoods and families. "People in Des Moines benefit from all your work," he said. Schoenenberger went on to compare small towns in Iowa to our "big city" neighborhoods, saying that they share the same Iowa values: neighbors helping neighbors.

State Senator Jack Hatch, who read the nominations, made specific mention of the city employee awardees: quiet professionals who interact with the public, addressing complaints and getting things done.

The accomplishments of all the awardees were impressive, and the entire evening reinforced the idea that the individuals and businesses who dedicate their time and talents to going the extra mile for their neighborhoods make Des Moines a great place to call home.

Birdland Shelter Lot & NE Corner of Union Park

Are you wondering when the Birdland Shelter parking lot will be completed? So are we. Here's current information from City Staff:

This project is controlled by the Army Corps of Engineers and is one of the last items to be completed under the new levee project. A city engineer is the liaison with the Corps and is working to provide Union Park Neighborhood Association with a status report. As soon as details become available, we will update our website and Facebook page. Many neighborhood residents have also been wondering when the northeast corner of Union Park will revert from a staging area for last year's sewer separation project back into our park.

The original contractor who worked on the project has recently gone out of business. The bond holder on the project is Cramer & Associates, a major bridge contractor in Des Moines. They are now in charge of the project however they have sub-contracted the remainder of the work to another local firm who is experienced in sewer work. The last phase of the project should be completed by the end of June, per the contract and barring major rain delays. Following completion, the sub-contractor will be required to clean up that corner of the park, removing all debris and fencing, adding 6" of topsoil and laying sod. If rain should delay the work, clean up could occur as late as August, with seeding rather than sod.

City Trims Trees on Thompson Avenue

In balmy February Public Works employees undertook a two week tree trimming project in the 1400 - 1500 blocks of Thompson Avenue. The stately sycamores were in need of a thorough 'haircut' by trained staff, cutting out dead limbs and low handing branches. The weather cooperated, allowing the bucket lift operator to reach high into

the towering 80-plus year old trees to carefully do his work. The rest of the crew on the ground were busy raking and feeding limbs into the heavy duty shredder / chopper. Neighbors talked with the crew about limbs overarching their yards, so that everyone's input made for job satisfaction!

Once the street sweeper was finished, Thompson Avenue looked well kept and inviting - a true gem on Des Moines' east side.

New HUD grant to Polk County

Polk County was recently awarded a Department, and their partners, to \$2,475,000 grant from the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD) to address leadbased paint hazards in Polk County and Dallas County. Funding is also available to address additional indoor health hazards like mold, radon and pests in some of the homes with lead hazards. These funds will leverage over \$2 million in additional local funds to allow Polk County Health

repair 142 homes in the two counties.

This is the second lead hazard control grant that has been awarded from HUD to Polk County. One hundred forty-three units (to date) have been made lead-safe through the initial grant. These units are listed in the Polk County Lead Safe Registry http://www.metroleadsafe.org/leadsafe-registry.aspx

Funds are available to assist homeowners whose income is less than 80% of the median family income and landlords whose tenants' incomes are less than 80% of the median family income. In addition, to be eligible a child under the age of six years old must live, or spend significant time, in the home and there must be identified lead hazards. For more information call 286-2115.

After School Program at Union Park UMC

Wednesdays are early out days for the Des Moines Public School System, but they are fun and busy days at Union Park United Methodist Church. Union Park UMC has an after school program for the neighbor kids every Wednesday. The program started several years ago with an elementary school program, known as UP Kids. It has been expanded in recent years to include middle school kids, known as the Accidental Angels.


The church bus picks up children after school and brings them to the church. Volunteers are waiting to help with homework, fun and study, and an occasional field trip. When parents arrive at 5:00, the family sits down together for a hot meal before heading home. This is all without charge to the family.

The Accidental Angels tended to a garden on the property last summer. They were able to learn a bit about how food is grown and why a food is considered healthy. They were also able to donate some of their harvest to the suppers being offered.

Surplus was offered to church members for a donation. Other projects are in the works for the UP Kids and Angels.

The after school program at Union Park UMC is a great way of reaching out to our neighborhood and providing a much needed service.





Where Located: The Information Center is located in the main lobby at City Hall, 400 Robert D Ray Drive, Des Moines, Iowa 50309. Hours of Operation -Regular office hours are Monday-Friday, 8:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m. but you can leave a voicemail message and they'll take care of reporting your concern on the next regular business day.

Broken /Missing Toter Carts - The Toter carts that we put our garbage and recyclables in are handy but sometime they get damaged or "disappear". These carts have a 10 year warranty and will be fixed or replaced at no cost. Call the City of **Des Moines Information Center at** (515) 283-4500 and they will send someone out. Anyone can call in a missing or damaged Toter. DO THIS NOW! Make a note of the numbers on the front of your Toter carts. When your Toter cart comes up missing, the police will want those numbers so you can file a stolen property report. It also makes it easier for the City to replace your cart.
