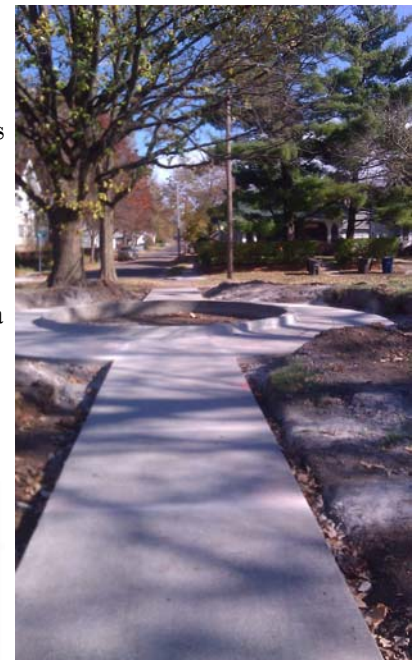

Improvements in Union Park.

You may have noticed some improvements in Union Park, most recently the sidewalk that continues from the steps at Mattern and East 9th into the park, with a flower bed and soon park benches will be installed there. The next improvement project we will tackle is to install concrete steps and a landing and railing near the stone bridge in the Birdland Marina. This ambitious project will be done in phases over the next several years.

Clean Union Park! Volunteer! Celebrate Earth Day!

April 25th 8:00 am – 1:00 pm

On Saturday April 25, we have the opportunity to help beautify Union Park. The Union Park Neighborhood Association is partnering with the Union Park United Methodist Church and the Des Moines Park and Recreation department to organize an effort to clean up the ravine south of Thompson Avenue in Union Park. Volunteers are needed to help pick up litter and pull brush, small branches, vines, etc. from the ravine and haul over to a close-by staging area so the city can haul the debris away later. It would be helpful if volunteers brought their own nippers and cutters. Be sure to wear appropriate clothing and shoes and gloves, hat, sunscreen, etc. Chain saws will not be needed. Water and treats will be available for workers. This will go on, rain or shine.

Originally UPNA proposed to clean out the area along Birdland Drive between the marina and 2nd Ave. Years of neglect and dumping had caused that area to be an eyesore. In March, Marsha Steele approached the Park and Recreation Department with the idea of partnering with UPNA on a clean-up day along Birdland Drive. It turns out the City had purchased a huge grinding machine. Paul Strome and Mike Gaul with the Park and Recreation Department thought it was a great idea, assessed the area and told Marsha they would start on it right away. They brought in heavy equipment, the grinding machine and city manpower to accomplish the job. If you have driven down Birdland Drive recently, you will be amazed. You can actually see the Ding Darling Shelter from Birdland Drive now!

Lower Oak Park and Highland Park Sewer Separation Project

The City of Des Moines is initiating a new project for the Lower Oak Park and Highland Park neighborhood. This project is included in the City’s Long Term Control Plan, developed to eliminate combined sewer overflows. The Lower Oak Park and Highland Park Sewer Separation Project is located along the Des Moines River, north of downtown. Currently, storm water in this area is collected and conveyed by both separate storm sewer and combined sewer systems. The combined storm sewer and sanitary sewer flows are conveyed to the Birdland Pump Station on Saylor Drive, south of the marina.

The Lower Oak Park and Highland Park Sewer Separation Project will remove storm water inlets from the combined sewer system. Approximately 10,000 linear feet of new storm sewer is anticipated to be constructed. The anticipated cost of the Project is \$11.8 million.

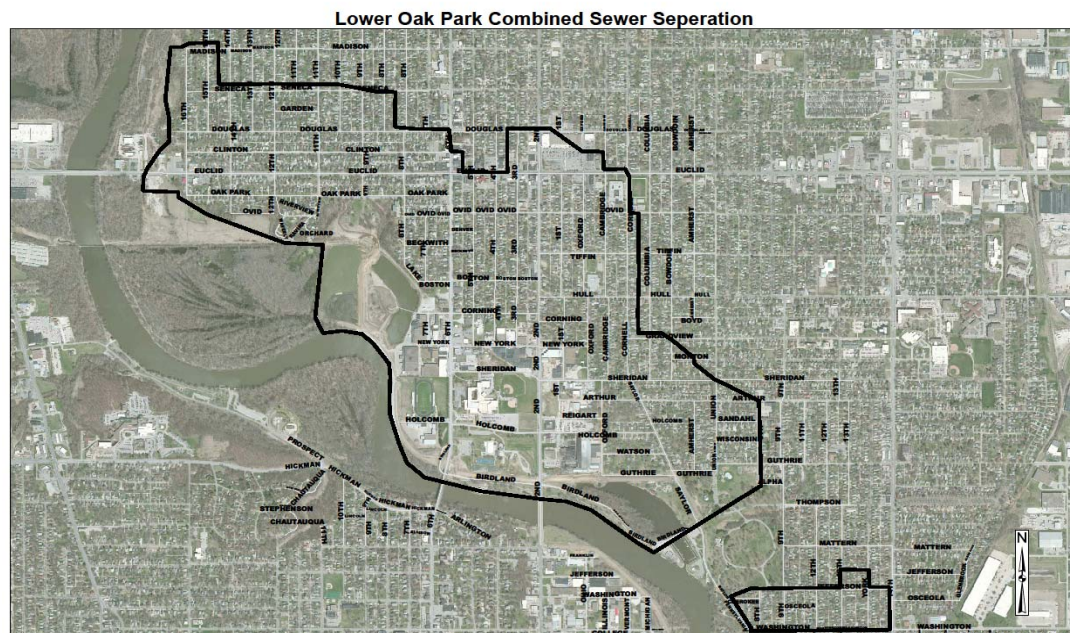
The Project is expected to be complete in 2018 and will help the City meet the nine minimum control requirements in the current City/Wastewater Reclamation Authority National Pollutant Discharge Elimination Systems (NPDES) permit.

To keep the public informed about the Project, the City of Des Moines has developed a Project website to help serve as a tool for current information about the Project, upcoming events and to provide opportunity to submit a comment to the Project team. For information go to: www.loweroakcso.com

SCRUB (Spring Cleanup to Remove Urban Blight)

Each month from now through November, the City of Des Moines is offering residents a great opportunity to get rid of junk, appliances and yard debris. On specific Saturdays, Des Moines residents may take items to the Transfer Station at 4198 Delaware Ave and yard debris may go to the Compost Facility at 1601 Harriett Street, where convenient off-loading is offered. Additionally, residents may also go to one of five “Mega SCRUBs” on specific days where free shredding services are also available. (see schedule).

SCRUB Guidelines:

Residents of Des Moines ONLY: Proof of Residency Required; Photo ID or current utility bill

No Commercial Haulers: Commercial Haulers MUST use landfill

Make sure your vehicle has plenty of gas. Disabled vehicles create delays

Vehicle Requirements: Cars, pickups and small trailers are preferred. Large trailers MUST be sponsored by neighborhoods.

Unloading Procedures: Ask where to unload

Plan to unload your own vehicle within 15 minutes. If you will not be able to unload by yourself in 15 minutes, bring additional help to assist you!

Place all items as directed. Clean up you own mess.

Scavenging/salvaging is NOT permitted at anytime.

Transfer Station Guidelines. Acceptable SCRUB Items:

Trash & Bulk Items: trash containers, general trash including furniture, lawn mowers with all fluids drained, televisions & tires (any size, on/off rim)

Appliances (no fee): air conditioners, refrigerators, freezers, microwaves, dehumidifiers, furnaces, stoves, washers, dryers, dishwashers, water heaters, etc.

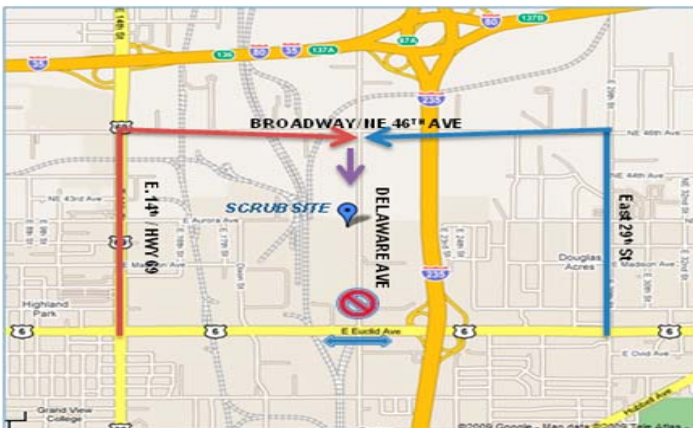
Compost Site Guidelines. Compost Facility-Items Allowed:

Yard debris, yard waste, brush, tree limbs (24" diameter or less, maximum length 10 feet), pruning, loose leaves, grass clippings, straw, hay and garden waste.

Directions: Enter from E 14th ST. to NE Broadway Ave.
Turn east on Broadway Ave. to Delaware Ave. Turn south
on Delaware Ave. & follow to MWA Transfer Station.



Metro Waste Authority **Compost Center**, 1601 Harriett St.
Directions: From I-235, go south on SE 14th ST. to Harriett Street.
Turn east on Harriett ST. and follow back to MWA
Compost Site.

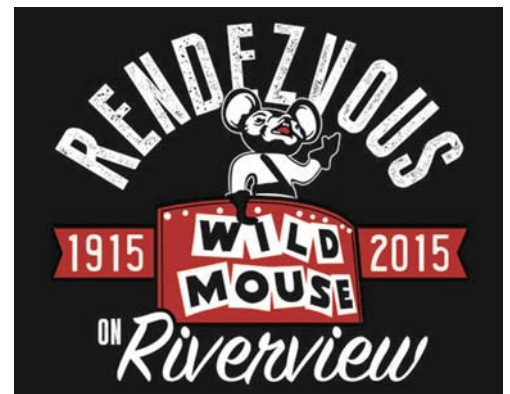

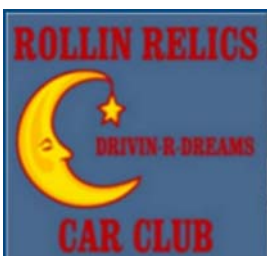
vide soft drinks and treats for purchase. In case of rain, Des Moines Parks and Recreation will make every attempt to reschedule.

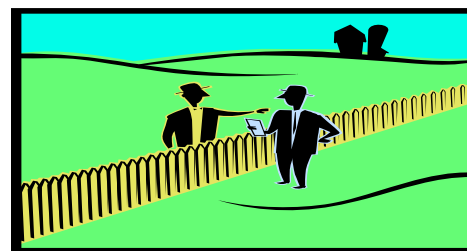
