The Views Forward Project

Since the launch of the View Forward Project in September 2017, Grand View University has generously made free tickets available to Union Park neighbors through its Viking Ticket Program. About 1900 tickets were made available to neighbors for sporting events, theater and music performances during the 2017-2018 school year. Tickets can be requested via the Grand View website, www.grandview.edu/views-forward.

A Community Garden, located at 1322 Boyd Street, also is a part of the Views Forward project. It started May 1 and will go through November 30. A ribbon cutting ceremony was May 3rd. The community garden is on undeveloped land near the GVU campus so individuals living and working in the neighborhood will have a space to grow fresh food.

The Grand View Athletics held a special free event on March 25th for kids in the neighborhood. The Ultimate Fan Fest gave kids an opportunity to get autographs and their pictures taken with the athletes and take home a free Grand View t-shirt.

Grand View staff, faculty and students contribute more than 56,000 hours of community service each year. The Views Forward Project will focus the power of volunteer efforts within our neighborhood.

The Views Forward Project is a long-term commitment by Grand View to its neighborhood. A neighborhood advisory committee helps plan new initiatives, gather input and provide feedback on the Views Forward Project planning. New initiatives will be launched throughout the year as projects and initiatives are identified that meet the needs of our community.

Habitat for Humanity 2018

Beginning in 2017, GDM Habitat began investing in the Birdland Area, which was devastated by flooding in 1993 and 2008. Prior to the floods there were 270 homes in the area, after only 54 remained. Habitat's efforts have included Rock the Block® repair projects in April 2017, a ten home blitz build on Watson Avenue, additional Rock the Block® projects in April 2018, and will soon include the creation of a one-of-a-kind pocket neighborhood. The pocket neighborhood will consist of 23 single-family

homes with a focus on connectivity and walkability. This unique and innovative neighborhood design contains a clustered group of neighboring houses that face towards a shared open space and trail. The infrastructure for the neighborhood is nearing completion with new construction homes beginning in June.

In 2018, GDM Habitat plans to create 29 affordable homeownership opportunities and assist more than 221 families through the Rock the Block®

repair program. In addition the organization will work with 50 families through the Financial Foundation for Success program, bringing the estimated total families served for the year to 300. Interested in getting involved? Visit www.gdmhabitat.org to learn more.

Although there is not a formal process for this award, nominations are appreciated and gratefully accepted. 


Race Like a Squirrel Returns to Union Park for 2018

The Heritage Carousel Celebrates its 20th Birthday on Saturday, June 9

The Heritage Carousel will mark its 20th birthday this year and to celebrate, they are inviting everyone to a party on Saturday, 9 from 12 to 4 pm. This free, family-friendly event is presented by Meredith Corporation and event features free food and snacks, free rides, a magician, face painting, super hero characters, balloon animals, and a community art project. The Carousel will also unveil a new display and transaction counter, constructed by a local woodworker and an information panel project by University of Northern Iowa describing the Carousel's history.

This hand-crafted icon is located at 1801 Pennsylvania Avenue on the north side of Union Park. It has been a part of the fabric of our neighborhood ever since it opened in 1998 and rides for children are still 50 cents, unchanged since it opened.

The vision and inspiration for the Carousel goes back to 1980 when J.C. "Buz" Brenton was in Hartford, Connecticut and walked through a city park, where he heard the music of a

band organ coming from a marvelous old wooden building. It housed a historic carousel with rows of beautifully painted, hand-carved horses. Through the dedication, determination, and partnership of Brenton and many Des Moines area community and business leaders, the Carousel opened in 1998. The first two years, it was under a big tent and had to be disassembled at the end of the season until a permanent pavilion was built to house it. By the second year, it clearly was a popular attraction.

The Carousel is a turn-of-the-century replica manufactured by Carousel Works, based in Mansfield, Ohio. It has an authentic band organ and the animals are hand carved and hand painted. There are hand painted artwork scenes of buildings and landscapes in Des Moines and nearby communities, depicting the heritage of the city and surrounding areas. The City of Des Moines maintains the area in the park and around the Carousel and the non-profit Des Moines Carousel Foundation owns and operates the ride.

"We are grateful to Meredith Corporation as our presenting sponsor, and have many local businesses and volunteers who are helping us host this festive birthday party," said Jackie Cacciatore, Executive Director. Nearly 500 guests and 1,500 riders are expected to enjoy the afternoon activities.

Ridership has grown steadily over the decades, and for the past several years, there have been over 50,000 riders throughout the season. This year the season opens on Saturday, May 19 with the Annual First Rider contest at 11 am.

2018 Rodine-Mickle Neighborhood Recognition Awards

Each year neighborhoods are asked to nominate one volunteer, one business, and one public servant that demonstrate outstanding leadership in the community for the Rodine-Mickle Neighborhood Recognition Award. The award is sponsored by the Des Moines Neighbors, a coalition of neighborhood associations, in memory of Alice Rodine, a long time Union Park area resident, leader and community activist and Robert W. Mickle, a noted community planner and neighborhood advocate. The award was started in 2001 and everyone who is nominated is recognized at the Annual Awards Dinner. Originally, recognition took place after a potluck dinner, but in recent years, it became a catered event at the Iowa Food Prize. This year the event returned to its roots as a potluck dinner at the Ding Darling Shelter, which allowed people who rarely get to see one another share food and happiness together and interact with one another. Alice Rodine would have approved of that.

This year, UPNA nominated Paul Cole for the Volunteer Award, Dan Adams for the Public Servant Award and the Heritage Carousel for the Business Award. The awards presentation took place during a potluck dinner at the Ding Darling Shelter House. We are proud that the Awards committee selected Dan Adams for the City-wide Overall Public Servant of the Year Award, and The Heritage Carousel was selected for the City-wide Overall Business of the Year Award. There was a great deal of competition for the Volunteer of the Year Award, which went to Eldon McAfee from the Drake Neighborhood Association.

Volunteer Nomination: Paul Cole, has been a member of the Union Park Neighborhood Association since 1993. In 2002, he became Membership Chair of UPNA and in 2006 he took on the duties of Treasurer, after the death of Nellie Ritchie. Since 2009, he has been the “Production Newsletter Editor” who formats, prints, assembles and mails the UPNA newsletters to members, as often as 4 or 5 times a year. He is the UPNA Representative to Des Moines Neighbors. In 2015, after the death of Marian Wynn, he took on the duties of Treasurer for Northeast Neighbors. He takes pride in his 1916 Craftsman home and has been awarded the UPNA Lawn of the Week Award. He is a humble volunteer who seeks no recognition or reward for the time and effort he puts in as a volunteer. He truly believes in Neighborhoods as a grassroots initiative and he is always available to help volunteer with special events. His honesty and consistency is valued by the UPNA officers.

Public Servant Nomination: Dan Adams served the Union Park area as the Neighborhood Based Delivery Service Inspector from June 2013 to December 2017. Every month he provided inspection reports to the UPNA Steering Committee and we enjoyed having him in attendance at the board meetings as often as he could be there. He was always responsive to our concerns. Like all neighborhood inspectors, he had dozens of types of code enforcements to handle, public nuisance actions, and rental inspections. At times he had to be part bad guy and other times he had to be part public relations. Dan was always a very patient with our

questions and an effective educator for the UPNA Steering Committee. He did a great job for UPNA and it is a better place to live because of him.

Business Nomination: The Heritage Carousel has played an active part in our community in Union Park since 1998 and this year it celebrates its 20th Birthday! Remarkably, rides for children are still just 50 cents! The Heritage Carousel was the concept of J.C. ‘Buz’ Benton, who formed a non-profit foundation to build and maintain the Carousel and pavilion. The first two years, it was under a big tent and had to be disassembled at the end of the year until a permanent pavilion was built to house it. Each year, the Carousel hosts a staggering number of events such as Clowns at the Carousel, the Rollin Relics Car Show and last year, it hosted the Neighbors Night at the Carousel with free rides and food for neighbors in the Union Park area. UPNA wishes the Heritage Carousel a Happy 20th Birthday!

For pot holes and other problems that relate to the Public Works Department, you can still call the Public Works 24 hour customer service center at (515) 283-

4950. It is available 24-hours a day, seven days a week and is answered by a real person.

Graffiti! - If you get hit with graffiti on your property, it is considered vandalism and may be a gang sign. You do not want it to stay there very long. It should be reported immediately to Sharon K. Neff at 515-248-6350. Or even better, take a picture and send it to her at SKNeff@dmgov.org She will locate the graffiti, take a picture and send to contacts in the Police Department. After that, the tag will be covered up, typically with white paint. The owner may opt to provide the matching paint to cover the affected area. If it is on an unpainted structure, siding, etc., it will be power washed to remove it.
