## **CLOWNS AT THE CAROUSEL**

The 19th<sup>th</sup> annual Clowns at the Carousel, held August 7, 2022 was another big success! It is always held during the International Clowns Week.

"We estimate about 1,000 children and their families attended" said Debbi Cooper (AKA Clickette), organizer of the event. Jackie Cacciatore, Director of the Heritage Carousel, said 645 rides were given this year, more than last year.

About 400 bike helmets were given away. Volunteers handed out 1880 cups of water/lemonade, 50 bottles of water and 42 bottles of Gatorade (people were thirsty). They gave out 400 bags of popcorn, and 214 pizzas were consumed. Snow Cones were popular as 800+ were given out. Fruit was a big hit as 400 apples and 400 bananas were distributed. There were inflatables, Safety Street, music, games, juggling, dancers, and stage entertainment. Ten talented clowns were on hand to make people laugh. All this was accomplished with a crew of just 27 volunteers

Thank you to the Korn Patch Klowns, their 14 sponsors and all the volunteers for this annual event. Kids have been enjoying this feature since 2003. Save the date, Sunday, August 6, 2023, for the next Clowns at the Carousel!



## SCRUB—Spring Cleanup to Reduce Urban Blight

**SCRUB** stands for SPRING CLEANUP to REDUCE URBAN BLIGHT. It is the City's mission to enhance the City's neighborhoods by allowing residents an opportunity to remove yard waste and debris from homes and yards to reduce the blighted areas within the City.

#### What kind of SCRUB events does the City of Des Moines sponsor?

MEGA SCRUB: An event that is hosted by select neighborhoods within their section of the City. Any Des Moines Resident may participate.

Transfer Station SCRUB: An alternate drop-off location used for SCRUB events. The Metro Waste Transfer Station is located at 4198 Delaware Ave.

Compost Site SCRUB: A drop off site designated for yard and tree debris during SCRUB events. The Des Moines Compost Site is located at 1601 Harriett Street.

#### **SCRUB Event Reminders Free Drop off - Delays Possible**

Proof of Residency is required - Bring a photo id or current utility bill.

Before each event, please review the **SCRUB** guidelines.

MEGA SCRUB events now offer Household Hazardous Waste Disposal. <u>See list of items.</u> (MEGA SCRUB sites only)

SCRUB events are free to Des Moines citizens, therefore you may experience longer wait times based on participation.



- dandelion crafts




## Union Park Neighborhood-wide Garage Sale May 27th

# CITY LAUNCHES "IMPROVING OUR NEIGHBORHOODS" INITIATIVE

**DES MOINES, IOWA** — **Wednesday, January 25, 2023** — The City of Des Moines launched an initiative today to strengthen and revitalize neighborhoods by offering property owners financial help for much-needed home repairs. The voluntary program, *Improving Our Neighborhoods (ION)*, will help homeowners make external repairs, connect to resources and navigate the home repair system.

City Manager Scott Sanders said that the goal of *ION* is two-fold – to repair deteriorating properties that diminish the value of neighboring homes and to reduce the number of houses degrading into nuisance properties requiring demolition by the City.

According to the last U.S. Census, more than half of the houses in Des Moines were built before 1960. The *ION* program will focus on roughly 4,000 houses identified in need of repairs. *ION* team members this week will begin reaching out across Des Moines to deliver informational packets and invite those homeowners to participate in the *ION* program.

Sanders said \$3.5 million in financial assistance has been committed to *ION* in 2023 that will help fund exterior property repairs for 100-150 Des Moines residents.

"With ION, we're striving to help homeowners with repairs that will make Des Moines neighborhoods healthier and more connected," Sanders said. "It's a significant challenge, but the Improving Our Neighborhoods initiative is a creative and ambitious effort that gets us moving in the right direction."

These are the exterior repairs that will be offered by *ION* as well as the criteria to qualify:

- Repair Assistance Services Offered
- Roof repairs/replacement
- Siding repairs/replacement
- Exterior foundation repairs
- Windows/doors
- Work on the property lot that affects the livability in the structure
- Driveways (only if a safety hazard exists)

#### Criteria

- Property must be within City limits
- Repairs are exterior, not interior
- Property taxes, utilities, and mortgage must be current
- Property must be insured or have the capability of being insured

Property Improvement Supervisor Dan Grauerholz said *ION* will provide financial assistance on a first-come, first-served basis to homeowners whose income falls below 80% of the Area Median Income (AMI). For the average household of three in Polk County, that would be just under \$71,000.

#### Assistance Options

For small projects, up to \$3,500 will be provided as a grant to qualified residents with an AMI of 80% and below.

Homeowners with an AMI of 50% or below will receive 100% forgivable funding up to \$20,000 and an additional \$20,000 in a 50/50 lien.

"Every member of our *ION* team knows that this program goes beyond fixing up houses, this is about helping people who might struggle a bit to get the job done themselves," Grauerholz said. "We successfully tested *ION* as a pilot project last year and the response was overwhelming and heartfelt."

Grauerholz said if there are repairs that don't qualify under *ION*, other community partners will be contacted to try and get the work done. For additional information about *Improving Our Neighborhoods*, go to <a href="DSM.city/ION">DSM.city/ION</a>.

## **Rocket Slide Still Under Repairs**

According to a Des Moines Register article on April 25, 2023, the 50 year old Rocket Slide is still closed and undergoing repairs. The Des Moines Parks and Recreation Department was quoted as saying "It WILL be back! Work on this equipment will likely be finished in the summer of 2024..."

The renovations will make sure the equipment meets modern safety codes. Improvements include the ramp and stairs, to make sure they are not so steep, the deck will have a non-slip material, and all the joints between the floor panels will be checked. The playground will be resurfaced. A custom made slide will replace the old slide and the entire structure will be repainted, according the Parks and Recreation Department.

## **Avoid a Parking Ticket 101**

Did you know it's a violation of Des Moines Municipal Code to park a vehicle on a city street or on city property without the license plate displaying the current registration sticker? Registrations may be renewed during the month before and the month after the registration month (normally the birth month of the registered owner). To avoid a parking ticket, apply early, and immediately put the sticker on your plate when you receive it. Remember, the sticker shows the month and year it expires.



## Grass Clippings in City Streets Create Problems



Grass clippings and other yard debris can clog the city's storm sewer intakes causing street flooding; therefore, the City is reminding residents and landscape companies that an administrative fine may be issued for blowing or raking grass clippings and leaves into a public street. The fine is \$50 for the first offense, \$75 for the second offense within the same year and the \$100 for the third offense.

## Good Neighbor Tip: Parked Vehicles

Vehicles parked on city streets must be in working condition with current registration. No vehicle may remain parked in one spot longer than 24 hours.

On private property, vehicles in the front yard must be parked on a hard surface, not on your lawn. Any inoperable or unlicensed vehicles must be stored inside a garage or shed. To report nuisance vehicles, call Neighborhood Inspections at 515-283-4046.
