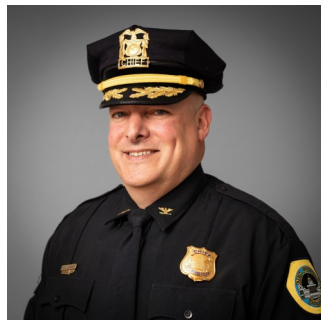

SCRUB—Spring Cleanup to Reduce Urban Blight

SCRUB stands for SPRING CLEANUP to REDUCE URBAN BLIGHT. It is the City's mission to enhance the City's neighborhoods by allowing residents an opportunity to remove yard waste and debris from homes and yards to reduce the blighted areas within the City.

What kind of SCRUB events does the City of Des Moines sponsor?

MEGA SCRUB: An event that is hosted by select neighborhoods within their section of the City. Any Des Moines Resident may participate.

Transfer Station SCRUB: An alternate drop-off location used for SCRUB events. The Metro Waste Transfer Station is located at 4198 Delaware Ave.

Compost Site SCRUB: A drop off site designated for yard and tree debris during SCRUB events. The Des Moines Compost Site is located at 1601 Harriett Street.

SCRUB Event Reminders Free Drop off - Delays Possible

Proof of Residency is required - Bring a photo id or current utility bill.

Before each event, please review the SCRUB guidelines.

MEGA SCRUB events now offer Household Hazardous Waste Disposal. (MEGA SCRUB sites only)

SCRUB events are free to Des Moines citizens, therefore you may experience longer wait times based on participation.

Grass Clippings in City Streets Create Problems

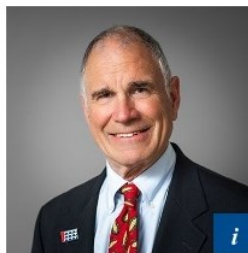


Grass clippings and other yard debris can clog the city's storm sewer intakes causing street flooding; therefore, the City is reminding residents and landscape companies that an administrative fine may be issued for blowing or raking grass clippings and leaves into a public street. The fine is \$50 for the first offense, \$75 for the second offense within the same year and the \$100 for the third offense.

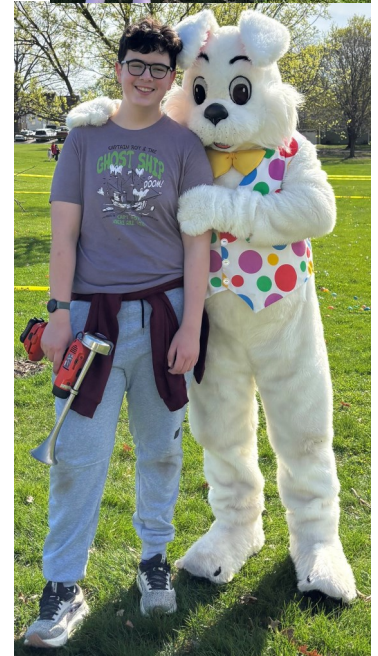

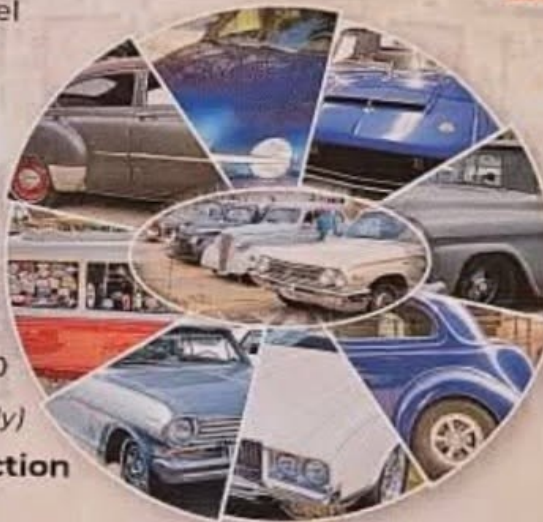

A letter from Angela Connolly

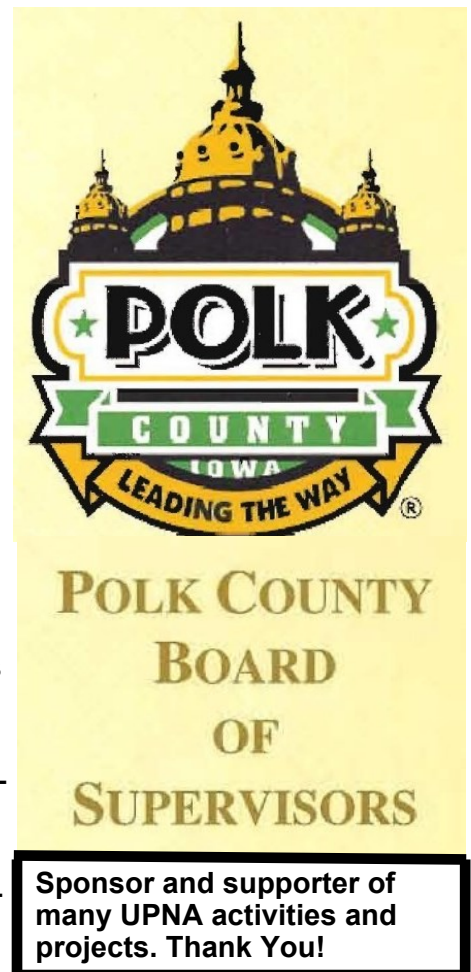
To: Union Park Neighborhood Association

Polk County approved our budget for the next fiscal year and are pleased that despite state legislation that is making it challenging to plan for future budget years, we were able to approve a 10 cent decrease in Polk County's levy rate. We know that property values continue to increase so to expect a decrease in your property taxes is not realistic. However, we are proud to have taken action on Polk County's portion of your taxes to help mitigate the typical increases in property taxes. We have found ways to absorb the levy reduction without impacting services to our community or our employees.

I am also very excited to report on the services being provided at the Polk County Life Services Center. This center opened last November and serves individuals who are experiencing a mental health or substance abuse crisis. It is a county owned building that houses a 23 hour crisis observation center, psychiatric urgent care and a sobering center. It is managed by St. Vincent de Paul. Since opening we have served over 500 individuals with many of them being dropped off by a local police officer or deputy. It is proving to be an outstanding resource and is successfully diverting individuals from our emergency rooms and jail to a place where they can receive appropriate services. The partnership between Broadlawns, St. Vincent de Paul and Polk County to provide these services has been more successful than any of us imagined.

I have been part of the founding board for Invest DSM and over the course of the last six years, we have made a tremendous impact on our communities. The non-profit helps finance home renovations, business improvements and jumpstarts revitalization in targeted neighborhoods. To date just under \$47 million has been invested in over 1,000 projects. For every dollar that Invest DSM invests in a project, there is an additional \$4.17 invested from other sources, including private investors. We are expanding our work into the Union Park neighborhood where we hope to enhance the family friendly atmosphere and focus on maintaining affordability and historic charm while making modern amenities more accessible for home owners. Beginning May 1, 2025, eligible homeowners will have access to two key programs designed to support and accelerate reinvestment: the Block Challenge Program and the Homeowner Renovation Program. These initiatives offer both financial assistance and personalized support to help residents maintain and improve their homes—while strengthening neighborhood pride and connection. Invest DSM Launches Programs in Union Park: New Tools for Homeowners to Update Their Homes and Invest Back in Their Neighborhood

Invest DSM is proud to announce the expansion of its revitalization efforts into the Union Park neighborhood.

Beginning **May 1, 2025**, eligible homeowners will have access to two key programs designed to support and accelerate reinvestment: the **Block Challenge Program** and the **Homeowner Renovation Program**. These initiatives offer both financial assistance and personalized support to help residents maintain and improve their homes—while strengthening neighborhood pride and connection.

These programs are more than just grants. They represent strategic investments in the long-term health, beauty, and equity of Union Park. Every repaired porch, fresh coat of paint, or upgraded heating system contributes to a larger vision: a resilient, welcoming neighborhood where families can thrive for generations to come.

Block Challenge Program

The Block Challenge Program encourages neighbors to work together to enhance their properties' curb appeal. When at least **three households on the same block** commit to participating, each becomes eligible for a **50% matching grant**, up to **\$2,500 per home**. Eligible projects include:

- Painting and exterior siding repairs
- Landscaping and tree planting
- Porch, step, or sidewalk improvements
- Lighting or fencing upgrades

Invest DSM supports participants throughout the process—helping coordinate group applications, advising on contractors and materials, and offering guidance every step of the way. More than just physical improvements, this program helps foster community pride, strengthen relationships, and create a shared sense of ownership in Union Park's future.

Homeowner Renovation Program

For residents planning more substantial improvements, the Homeowner Renovation Program offers deeper investment. Eligible homeowners can apply for **significant financial assistance**, with funding levels based on the home's location and the scope of the proposed work. This program is ideal for larger-scale projects, including:

- Room additions or major structural upgrades
- Electrical and plumbing modernization
- Roof or foundation repairs
- Kitchen and bathroom renovations
- Energy-efficiency improvements (windows, insulation, HVAC)
- Accessibility modifications to support aging in place

Each project is developed in collaboration with Invest DSM staff, who assist with planning, contractor selection, project management, and quality control. The goal is to preserve and enhance the neighborhood's housing stock—ensuring homes are safe, modern, and built to last.

Union Park is a neighborhood rooted in history and community spirit. Its diverse housing, mature trees, and engaged residents make it one of Des Moines' most treasured areas. By launching these programs here, Invest DSM is not only acknowledging the neighborhood's unique strengths—but also committing to its long-term sustainability and vitality. Des Moines Heritage Trust announces historic preservation award winners

The champions and projects that represent the best of historic preservation in the community will be recognized during the Des Moines Heritage Trust's first historic preservation awards dinner later this year.

The award winners were recently announced, and they include a developer who focuses on the redevelopment of historic buildings, an architect who was at the forefront of historic preservation and projects, both commercial and residential, that exemplify the history and futures of those buildings.

An iconic piece of playground equipment also gets a nod from the Des Moines Heritage Trust.

Tim Waddell, president of the nonprofit's board, said too often historic properties only get attention when they become a nuisance or at risk of demolition, and the awards are intended to "celebrate historic preservation in a positive way."

"Our historic buildings are part of the cultural fabric of our community," he said. "It's not just history. It's all part of the cultural fabric. For some reason or another, these buildings were built and they were built by the people who lived here and they were important in one way or another. We may not always know what the original purposes are, but I think they are an important part of our cultural heritage and fabric today, in the past and into the future. I think that is all part of how we can celebrate, if we are able to retain them, that people will know what people in the past felt was important."

The award winners were selected among nominations that were submitted on the Des Moines Heritage Trust's social media sites. Nominations were reviewed by board members, who then decided winners for each category.

This year's Special Project of the Year winner is:



Union Park rocket slide – city of Des Moines

"It's not a building, so that's why we call it a special project," Waddell said. "The Des Moines Heritage Trust is into the preservation of historic buildings, but we felt we wanted to recognize the Union Park rocket slide. It was nominated and it came before the board and there was lots of discussion about it. We felt like it was important to recognize the park and the city of Des Moines. It was a very expensive project that could easily have been sent to the scrapyard as a piece of metal, but instead they recognized the iconic value and that it was a beloved playground for the past, present and future of our community."

NOTE: The Rocket Slide is 54 years old this year!

Rollin Relics Supports the Carousel



Every year in late August, the Rollin Relics Car Club sponsors the Cruise to the Carousel car show. Profits from the show are donated to the Des Moines Heritage Carousel to keep the rides for children at only 50 cents. They are the largest annual contributor to the Heritage Carousel. BIRDLAND MASTER PLAN UPDATE

Hi Union Park Neighbors!

Here is an update on the progress the City of Des Moines Parks and Rec Department has made on the Birdland Master Plan.

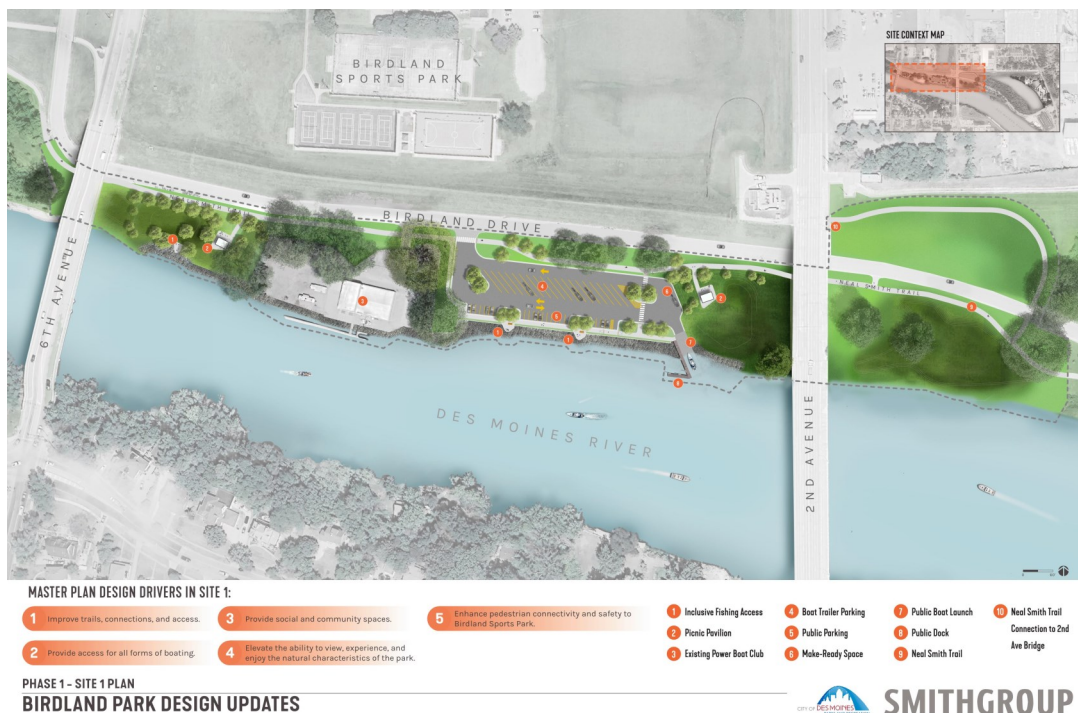
Phase 1A and 1B are progressing. 1A is the work that is along the river mostly between 2nd and 6th Avenues which includes the new boat ramp.

Phase 1B is the improvements in Birdland Park between the levee and Saylor Road which includes a playground, skating ribbon and many other things. Phase 1B also includes projects that ICON (Iowa Confluence Water Trails) will be completing. The ICON projects include shoreline improvements and parking lot reconstruction ICON Phase 1

Schedule for 1A: the designers are finishing plans and the city is securing the last small bit of grant funding. The project will go out for bidding this year in the fall. Work will begin in 2026.

Schedule for 1B: the designers are working on the plans for this phase and expect to have them ready for bidding over the winter of 2025/2026. Work on this phase will also begin in 2026.

We can expect a lot of construction to be happening in Birdland Park starting next year. It will take around a year to complete and when done, will confirm Union Park Neighborhood's spot as the best neighborhood in the galaxy.

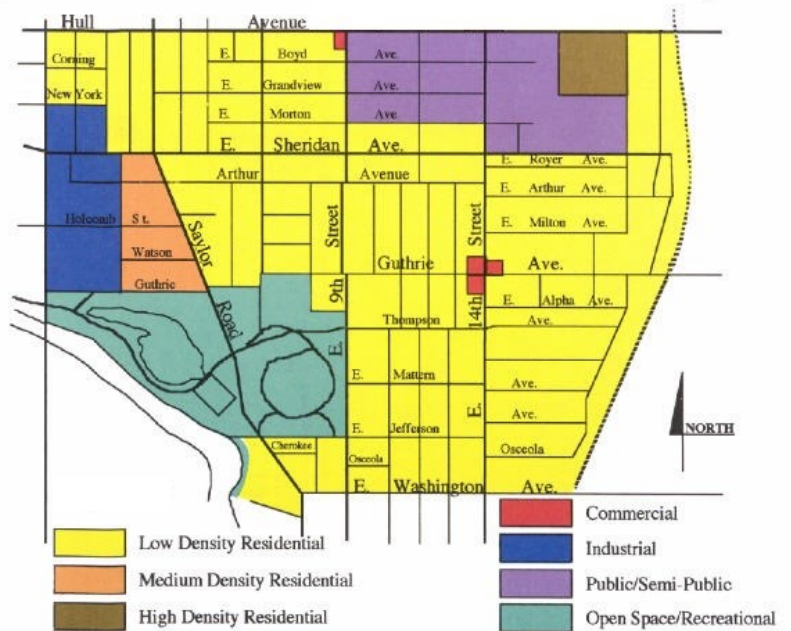
